



Information for Scholarship Applicants

Scholarship applicants do not need to apply for individual Cambridge Australia Scholarship awards. All applicants for entrance to the University of Cambridge will automatically be considered for all of the awards for which they are eligible.

Basic steps:

- Access the University of Cambridge website and read about how to apply, including application deadlines (see Important Websites).
- Make contact with the Department in which you wish to study well before the closing date in relation to your proposed research project.
- Decide which colleges you wish to nominate in your application.
- Apply by submitting the online application via the Applicant Portal and complete the funding section to be considered for funding through the Graduate Funding Competition.
- Pay the application fee (£60).
- Upload the necessary supporting documentation via the Applicant Portal.

The Cambridge academic year begins on 1 October and most graduate courses start in October.
